




# Jeffco Connect Instructions to Allow Network Access (Student)

In an effort to accommodate student's use of personal electronic devices as part of the overall learning environment and to provide access to a secure wireless network, the Jeffco-Instructional (BYOD) network is now available in the list of wireless networks District wide.

**Students will not automatically be able to connect their personal devices to the Jeffco-Instructional (BYOD) network.** Both the student and a Parent/Guardian must agree to opt in to the network through Jeffco Connect. Follow the steps below to be allowed onto the BYOD network. Parent/Guardians need to follow the instructions provided [here](#).

1.	Log into Jeffco Connect and click on your name. Click <a href="#">here</a> to go to Jeffco Connect. Your Username and Password are the same that you use to log into any Jeffco Public Schools device.
